










TTSA and TTAD Land Swap · Suggested several years prior · A functional exchange of acreage and value between agencies • The advantage for TTSA is an enhancement to the adjacent flat land available

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Land Use Risk Assessment Study (LURAS) Findings ► Change in disinfection processes at the Water Reclamation Plant (WRP) allows for potential release of surplus parcels Evaluation of constraints to development based on land use types: residential, commercial, recreation, and public use Consideration of resource areas: Land Use, Planning, and Land Ownership; Hazards, Nuisance, and Public Safety; Natural Resources

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TTSA Land Use Policy Principles: Summary of TTSA's land use guidelines Open for public use from dawn until dusk Special use permits available for community groups Commercial use is restricted without prior consent Dumping and wastewater disposal are strictly prohibited Criteria for surplus land designation ▶ Normal facility operations do not cause a hazard to the area ▶ Land is not required for future expansion of the facility Potential future land use will not interfere with plant operations ▶ Does not interfere with open use and environmentally sensitive lands Determined to be surplus by TTSA Board of Directors upon the recommendation of staff

Land furthest to the West is least likely to interfere with plant operations Property to the South of Joerger Drive as a continuance of the Bus Facility development Initially Identified Surplus Priority

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
