

COMMUNITY BUFFER FUEL REDUCTION PROJECT (OV-4 PHASE 2) CONTRACT AMENDMENT APPROVAL

- **SUBJECT:** Contract Approval OV-4 Phase Two Fuel Reduction Project
- **BACKGROUND:** The OV-4 project will address wildfire risk by establishing a 150-foot-wide shaded fuel break around residential properties, buildings, and other structures in Olympic Valley. The primary objective is to decrease the continuity of surface and ladder fuels thereby decreasing flame length, fire intensity, spread rate, and duration. The project covers 90 acres adjacent to Olympic Valley neighborhoods. Phase 1 covers 70 acres and Phase 2 covers 20 acres.

Project funding is provided by the District, the Truckee Tahoe Airport District and the Truckee North Tahoe Forest Management Program (TNTFMP) through the Tahoe Truckee Community Foundation and the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection's Wildfire Resilience Program (CAL FIRE).

Phase 1 was bid in July and October 2024, with bids ranging from \$4,950 to \$14,300 per acre. High Sierra Fire, Inc. submitted the lowest responsive bid at \$4,950 per acre. and the District subsequently entered into a contract for Phase 1. RPF Bradfield completed design and permitting of OV-4 Phase 2, and High Sierra Fire, Inc. submitted a proposal for the Phase 2 work at the same unit bid price as Phase 1.

DISCUSSION: High Sierra Fire, Inc. was selected for Phase 1 based on experience, cost, and ability to complete the work within the project timeline. For the same reasons, staff recommend contracting High Sierra Fire, Inc., for Phase 2. Work will commence in early May, weather permitting, with completion of both phases anticipated by November 15, 2025. The board approved and published a notice of exemption on August 30, 2024. The project operates under a CAL FIRE 10% Dead and Dying Exemption.

- ALTERNATIVES: 1. Authorize the General Manager to execute a contract amendment with High Sierra Fire, Inc. for an amount not-to-exceed \$99,000.00 and authorize the General Manager authority to approve any change orders to the construction contract up to \$10,000 (approximately 10% of the total bid price)
 - 2. Do not authorize the General Manager to execute contract documents.
- **FISCAL/RESOURCE IMPACTS**: Grant funding will reimburse the cost of the contractor's work on the Project.
- **RECOMMENDATIONS:** Authorize the General Manager to execute contract documents with High Sierra Fire Inc. for an amount not-to-exceed \$99,000.00 and authorize the General Manager authority to approve any change orders to the construction contract up to \$10,000 (approximately 10% of the total bid price)

Contractor History

We plan to approach this project with a crew of 7-12 men using Stihl chainsaws and a 12 Bandit Chipper to broadcast chips and not to exceed 6 inches in depth. All crewman will have PPE gear and daily safety tailgate sessions to go over the hazards of the job. We will post road hazard signs if and where needed. We don't anticipate doing any burning at this time. We will work within the specified hours of the contract.
