

#### ADOPTION OF FISCAL YEAR 2025 – 2026 RATES AND CHARGES

SUBJECT: Adoption of Water, Sewer, and Garbage Fees for FY2025 - 2030

**BACKGROUND**: In January 2025, the Board approved the initiation of the Proposition 218 process to adopt updated water, sewer, and garbage rates. As such, a Notice of Public Hearing was mailed to all affected property owners and customers, initiating a 45-day protest period. The notice included proposed rate adjustments and the rationale supporting them. This report brings the item back to the Board to formally conduct the public hearing and consider the adoption of the proposed rates.

> In addition to service rates, the Board is being asked to consider approving updated connection fees and other miscellaneous charges for services the District provides. The connection fees were included in the study but not noticed through the same Proposition 218 process. All updated rates, fees, and schedules will be adopted together under a single resolution.

**DISCUSSION**: The proposed rates for water and sewer services were developed through a comprehensive cost-of-service and rate study conducted by HDR Engineering, Inc. This study ensured that the rates are equitable, compliant with legal requirements, and sufficient to recover the costs of providing services. The current year represents the first of a five-year rate schedule developed under the HDR study. The garbage fees were adjusted based on a contract with Tahoe Truckee Sierra Disposal, the third-party contractor that performs all residential garbage collection in the Valley. The rate structure for all utilities considers operational needs, capital improvements, and long-term financial sustainability of each service.

At the time of this report preparation, the District has received one protest letter. The concerns expressed in the letter related solely to the garbage fee increases. Upon the close of the public hearing, if the number of valid protests received does not meet the threshold required, the legislative body may proceed with imposing the proposed property-related fees or charges.

The proposed rates include a rate adjustment annually over a five-year period. Beginning in 2026 and continuing annually over the next five years, the Board will assess the District's revenue and expenses to evaluate and set utility rates up to the adopted maximum without conducting a majority protest proceeding.

The approved Cost of Service Study and Connection Fees studies are available on the District's website.

- **ALTERNATIVES:** 1. Conduct Proposition 218 Ballot Protest Proceeding and if a majority protest does not exist, approve Resolution 2025-08, adopting rates and charges for water, sewer, and garbage services for FY2025 – 2026 and setting the maximum rates for charges for FY 26/27, 27/28, 28/29, 29/30.
  - Do not approve Resolution 2025-08.

**FISCAL/RESOURCE IMPACTS**: The FY2025 – 2026 budget assumes water will generate \$2,508,000 in revenue, sewer will generate \$1,841,000 in revenue, and garbage will generate \$423,000 in revenue.

**RECOMMENDATION**: Approve Resolution 2025-08, adopting rates and charges for water, sewer, and garbage services for FY2025 - 2026.

#### **RESOLUTION 2025-08**

# A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE OLYMPIC VALLEY PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT ADOPTING ADJUSTMENTS TO RATES AND CHARGES FOR WATER. SEWER AND GARBAGE

- **WHEREAS**, The Olympic Valley Public Service District ("District") is a public agency organized pursuant to California Water Code §30000, et seq; and
- **WHEREAS**, the District provides Water, Sewer, and Garbage service to customers within its boundaries and the District is authorized to set rates for providing such services; and
- **WHEREAS**, the District is currently updating its own Code and, as relevant to this Resolution, this includes a reorganization as to where its rates are codified; and
- **WHEREAS,** this Resolution's first purpose is therefore to effect a non-substantive recodification of certain water, sewer, and garbage rates, without increasing or extending those rates in any way; and
- **WHEREAS**, the District hired HDR Engineering, Inc. to perform a comprehensive water and sewer rate study that included a cost-of-service analysis and revenue requirement analysis. The Study established the nexus between the cost of serving customers and rates charged to customers, and:
- **WHEREAS**, the Study, available on the District's website, demonstrated that the District must increase certain water and sewer rates to meet its costs to provide these services. Factors contributing to this need include, but are not limited to, increases in capital replacement costs, energy, insurance, and other operational expenses. The cost of service analysis also indicated that the revenue derived from the different user classes was in need of rebalancing to better reflect the actual cost of providing water service to each class; and
- WHEREAS, the District has contracted with Tahoe-Truckee Sierra Disposal to provide solid waste collection services to customers within the District's boundaries, and the District is authorized to set rates for providing such solid waste services; the costs associated with providing solid waste services within the District have increased due to increased contract fees, insurance and other operational expenses; and
- **WHEREAS,** this Resolution's second purpose is therefore to increase certain water, sewer, and garbage rates as recommended in the Study; and
- **WHEREAS**, the complete list of District rates for water, sewer, and garbage service is attached hereto as Exhibit A. This list includes rates the District does not increase or extend by this Resolution, but that it simply recodifies as part of the non-substantive code reorganization described above; and
- **WHEREAS**, the rates the District proposes to increase by this Resolution, and which constitute a subset of the complete list in Exhibit A, are attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

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**WHEREAS**, on January 28, 2025, the Board accepted, approved, and adopted the rate Study and directed staff to proceed toward adoption of the rate schedules as attached hereto. It further set a public hearing for June 24, 2025, to consider any protests regarding the proposed rate adjustments set forth in Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the District has followed, without limitation, the applicable procedural requirements of Proposition 218 (Cal. Const., art. XIII D, § 6) and the County Water District Law (Government Code, § 30000 et. seq) for increasing service rates; and

**WHEREAS**, notice of the proposed rates referred to in Exhibit B has been given as provided by law, and after a public hearing, there was no majority protest as described in article XIII D, section 6(a) of the California Constitution; and

**WHEREAS**, customers served by the Olympic Valley Mutual Water Company, which operates within OVPSD's boundaries, will only be impacted by wastewater and garbage rate adjustments.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
- 2. The rates and charges attached hereto as Exhibit A (2025-26 Water Fee Schedule, 2025-26 Sewer Fee Schedule, and 2025-26 Garbage Fee Schedule) and Exhibit B (2025-2030 Water, Sewer and Garbage Rates) are adopted and shall take effect July 1, 2025, until they are amended, suspended, and/or rescinded by the Board of Directors. Except as to the rates included with Exhibit B, this act does not increase or extend these rates in any way.
- 3. The Board that the charges set forth in Exhibit B meet the requirements set forth in article XIII D, section 6 of the California Constitution.
  - a. Revenue from these rates will not exceed the funds the District requires to provide each utility service.
  - b. Revenue from these rates will not be used for any purpose other than that for which the rates are imposed.
  - c. The rate imposed on a given customer will not exceed the proportional cost of the service attributable to that customer.
  - d. All of these rates will be imposed for a service actually used by, or immediately available to, affected property owners.
  - e. None of these rates will be imposed for general government services available to the public at large in substantially the same manner as they are to affected property owners.
- 4. Pursuant to Government Code § 54354, et seq., delinquent charges and all penalties thereon, when recorded as provided in said Government Code sections, shall constitute a lien upon the real property served and such lien shall continue until the charges and all penalties thereon are fully paid or the property sold.

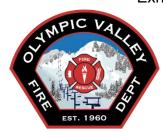
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- 5. To the extent any Charges established by this Resolution are inconsistent with any other fee or charge previously adopted by the Board of Directors, it is the explicit intention of the Board of Directors that the Charges adjusted pursuant to this Resolution shall prevail.
- 6. This Resolution complies with the further provisions of Government Code §54350, et seq., and will otherwise comply with the law. The Board of Directors finds that the rates herein are not discriminatory or excessive, and will be sufficient under Government Code §54350, et seq., and Water Code §31007 to:
  - a. Pay the operating expenses of District.
  - b. Provide for repairs and depreciation of works owned or operated by the District.
  - c. Pay the interest on any bonded debt.
  - d. So far as possible, provide a fund for the payment of the principal of the bonded debt as it becomes due.
- 7. The Board of Directors further finds that the rates attached hereto meet all of the above criteria.
- 8. If any portion of this Resolution, including but not limited to any particular rate adopted hereby, is held to be unconstitutional, invalid, or otherwise unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, that holding shall not negate any other portion of this Resolution.
